Elaine Holmes, in recognition of pioneering the use of multivariate statistics for the analysis of spectroscopic data acquired

for metabolites, enabling the field of metabolomics/metabonomics to advance in a wide range of disease and therapeutic areas, and being instrumental in applying this approach to the first metabolome/genome-wide association studies.



Kazuki Saito, in recognition of his high-profile scientific contributions to plant metabolomics, pioneering the integrated study

of metabolomics and transcriptomics, and early service in organizing the metabolomics community. He was a member of Metabolomics Society Board of Directors from 2010-2014, and hosted 5th International Conference of Plant Metabolomics in Yokohama in 2008.
